Three Motets (sung in Latin)

Charles Villiers Stanford

The Three Motets, Op 38 are among the finest of Stanford's choral compositions. *Justorum Animae*, in three sections, takes its text from the Book of Wisdom. *Coelos Ascendit Hodie*, an Ascensiontide motet, scored for double choir, is joyful in character and much interplay can be heard between the two choirs. It ends with a superb *Amen*, concluding on a vibrant eight-part chord. The text of *Beati Quorum Via* is from Psalm 119, verse 1. Written for six voices, it is meditative in character with much textural interest.

Jesu Meine Freude (sung in German)

Johann Sebastian Bach

Jesu Meine Freude was written in 1723, for the funeral of Johanna Maria Käsin, the wife of Leipzig's postmaster. In eleven movements, it is the longest and most musically complex of the Bach's motets. It is based on a chorale melody, with text by Johann Franck, written from the believer's point of view, praising the gifts of Jesus Christ as well as longing for his comforting spirit. The words of the movement nos. 2, 4, 6, 8, and 10 are based on the Epistle to the Romans 8:1–2, 9–11. The scriptures here speak of Jesus Christ freeing man from sin and death. Analysis reveals an arch-like structure, a balanced musical symmetry around the 6th movement double fugue. Sections 3–5 and 7–9 both contain a chorale, a trio and a quasi-aria movement. Movements 2 and 10 use the same musical material and the work begins and ends with the identical chorale, albeit set to different words.

INTERVAL

Requiem (sung in Latin)

Gabriel Fauré

Fauré is said to have written his *Requiem* 'for the pleasure of it'. The first version dating from 1887 had just five movements, omitting the *Offertorium* and *Libera Me*. An expanded version including these movements dates from 1893, the *Libera Me* having originally been written as an independent composition for baritone and organ. At this stage extra instruments were added. A third version, using full orchestra, was premièred in 1900 and became the standard version to use until recently. In 1983 Rutter researched Fauré's original orchestration and produced a new score based on Fauré's original intentions. Tonight's performance uses this version, but in its minimal form with instruments that just double one another omitted.

Jesu Meine Freude

1. Chorale

Jesus, my joy! Jesus, my treasure!

2. Chorus

Those who are in Christ Jesus, walk after the way of the Spirit.

Let Satan rage, let the enemy fume, Jesus will protect me.

4. Chorus

Jesus has freed me from sin and death.

5. Chorale

God's strength holds me; earth and abyss must fall silent, however much they might rumble.

6. Chorus

You are not of the flesh but of the Spirit, since the Spirit of God lives in you.

7. Chorale

Jesus, my joy! Misery, want, torture, shame and death shall never part me from Jesus.

8. Chorus

If Christ is in you, the Spirit is life for the sake of righteousness.

9. Chorale

Good night, sins, stay far away, never again come to light! Good night, pride and glory!

10. Chorus

The Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you.

11. Chorale

My Master of joy, Jesus, comes here. Jesus, my joy.

Requiem Gabriel Fauré

1. Introit et Kyrie

Grant eternal rest to them, Lord, and let perpetual light shine on them.

2. Offertoire

O Lord Jesus Christ, King of Glory, free the souls of the dead from infernal punishment.

3. Sanctus

Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts. Hosanna in the highest!

4. Pie Jesu

Merciful Lord Jesus, grant them rest, eternal rest.

5. Agnus Dei et Lux Aeterna

Lamb of God, who removes the sins of the world, grant them rest and let perpetual light shine on them.

6. Libera Me

Free me, Lord, from eternal death, on that day when you shall come to judge the world by fire.

Grant eternal rest to them and let perpetual light shine on them.

7. In Paradisum

May angels lead you into Paradise and may you have eternal rest.
